

## Rhyming Couplets

A Rhyming Couplet is a two line poem where the last word of each line Rhyme with one another.

Example:

You love fun dip and cherry coke.

I like the way you laugh when I tell a joke.

Both coke and joke rhyme, therefor, this would be a rhyming couplet.

## Quatrains

Quatrains are similar to rhyming couplets, but are a four line poem. The difference with a quatrain is that not all 4 lines need to rhyme with one another and the rhyme scheme can change from poem to poem.

Example:

Just to match with them alligator shoes  
He's a rich man so he's no longer singing the blues  
He's singing songs about material things  
And platinum rings and watches that go bling
